Published: 12 July 2023 Effective: 4 September 2023 Our Reception Class provision is designed to ensure we meet the requirements of 'The Early Years Foundation Stage' framework.

# Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA)

- The reception baseline assessment will provide the basis for a new way of measuring the progress primary schools make with their pupils
- Unlike the current progress measure, this will give schools credit for the important work they do with their pupils between Reception and Year 2

- Creating a self-portrait- line drawing




### Autumn 1

- Curiosity, noticing, questioning things in the environment

- Winter
- Fiction and Non-fiction
- Sequencing events in a story
- Orally retelling a familiar story
  - Writing labels, captions and short sentences
- Number up to 5
- Commenting on similarities and differences, noticing

Bring book bag in every day


- □ 1:1 and Guided reading sessions
- Sent home every week is a Big Cat book (which matches your child's phonic level) as well as another book from our school library which you can share together for enjoyment
- □ It is vital your child reads with you at home <u>everyday</u>
- □ Read stories to your child in English or your home language
- ☐ Ask questions to your child about what they can see in the pictures and what they think might happen next


